Zoom Workshop – Etiquette and BestPractices

Here are some great tips on etiquette and best practices when joining a Zoom meeting. We hope these help you get the best out of your experience!!

BEFORE THE MEETING/WORKSHOP			
	Test Your Technology	Test all your technology	
		(including camera/video, Wi-Fi, and screen sharing if you are the host or presenter)	
	Practice Speaking to the Camera and Not the Screen	Our tendency is to look at the person on the screen, but you should look at the camera when you speak so the audience feels like you're talking directly to them.	
	Dress Appropriately	Take a few minutes to throw on a clean shirt and brush your hair. The best part of actually getting ready while working remotely is that you'll put yourself in the right headspace to be productive.	
DURING THE MEETING/W	/ORKSHOP		
88	Speak Up Upon Entry	When you enter a small meeting (around 2 to 5 people) announce yourself when you join. Just make sure not to interrupt someone mid-sentence.	
12	Be Attentive	Don't stare at your phone while other people are presenting, be attentive and present.	
	Silence Your Phone	Turn off all notifications and make sure your cell phone is on silent	
	Don't Type in the Background	Leave your keyboard alone Unless you want to ask questions and make comments silently if desired using the "Chat" feature. In this case make sure your microphone is muted.	
	Be Respectful – Raise Your Hand	Don't interrupt other people when they're speaking (or attempt to speak over them) If you want to speak, physically raise your hand or use the "raise hand" feature that is available in the participant panel.	



%	Mute Yourself	Mute your microphone when you're not talking. This will help eliminate any feedback or background noise that can be heard in your environment.
	Don't Multitask	Don't work on other tasks (like checking email) during the virtual meeting It may be tempting to check your inbox or carry on a side conversation during a dull moment in a meeting, but don't do it! You might miss out on key information or an opportunity to give input
رنے	Stay Seated and Stay Present	If you're using your webcam, use attentive body language: sit up straight, don't make big extraneous movements, and don't let your eyes wander too much.

I. Recognize God's Presence in Your Life

- 1. 1 Peter 5:6
 - Our behavior fails to acknowledge God's sovereignty and Him being the giver of life.
 - The Bible tells us to humble ourselves under the mighty power of God.
- Genesis chapters 37- 40
 - In the Bible, Joseph had a stretch of time during his life where nothing seemed to be right.
 - Joseph acknowledged the hand of God in his life and remained committed to living for Him.

 - To honor something or someone means to assign value or worth to a thing or person.
 - Honoring with actions that come from the heart, not just merely words coming from our lips.
