Text: Mark 1:14-20

## Introduction:

1. We're in a series entitled: "The Making of a Disciple."

"Making of a Disciple - Christ **calls ordinary** people to follow Him, so they can do **extraordinary** things **through** Him as His Disciples."

2. A Disciple is a "follower of Christ." – Biblical definition: someone who **submits** to follow the **beliefs** and rules of **behavior** of another, and assist in spreading the teachings.

Review: Call of a Disciple - Why does Christ Call Us?

- 1. God called us because He chose us in Christ before the world began to adopt us into His family, so we can experience His love for us in Christ.
- 2. God calls us by His grace to proclaim the gospel, so we can bring many children into the family of God.

Today's Message: The Conversion of a Disciple

"Converting a sinner to a Christ follower."

**Matthew 1:14.** Later on, after John was arrested, Jesus went into Galilee, where he **preached God's Good News. 15.** "The time promised by God has come at last!" he announced. "The **Kingdom** of God is near! **Repent** of your sins and **believe** the Good News!"

"The conversion of a sinner into a Disciple of Christ is a supernatural work of the Holy Spirit that cannot be undone."

I Corinthians 12:3. So I want you to know that no one speaking by the Spirit of God will curse Jesus, and no one can say (confess) Jesus is Lord, except by the Holy Spirit. (NLT)

Holy Spirit convicts you of:

- a) Sin
- b) Righteousness
- a) Judgment

References: John 16:8, Psalms 51:5, I Peter 3:10-13

"Holy Spirit not only **convicts** you of **sin but convinces** you that you're a **sinner** and need a Savior in Jesus Christ.

**Wrap up**: "Disciples of Christ <u>hear</u> the gospel and become <u>convicted</u> by the Holy Spirit of their <u>sin</u>, Christ's <u>righteousness</u>, and the <u>judgment</u> of God."

- 2. You \_\_\_\_\_ v15b. "The Kingdom of God is near! Repent of your sins and believe the Good News!"
  - a) You're **sorrowful** about your sin(s)
  - b) You change the way you think
  - c) You turn to a **new way** of living

References: 2 Corinthians 7:10, Matthew 3:8, Luke 15:7, Acts 17:30, 2 Peter 3:9, Acts 11:18, 1 John 1:9

**Wrap up**: "Disciples of Christ are **sorrowful** about their **sin**. They change the way they think about **sin** and to the **righteousness** of **Christ** to receive **forgiveness** and a new way of living (salvation)."

- 3. You \_\_\_\_\_ v15b. "Repent of your sins and <u>believe the Good News (Gospel)!</u>" Acts 20:21
  - a) Repent you change the way you think
  - b) Faith you turn to the gospel
  - c) Follow you obey and share the teachings

References: Acts 20:26-27, Titus 3:3-7

**Wrap up:** Disciples of Christ **believe** the gospel, **repent** of their sin, **turn** to God, and **believe** Jesus Christ is Lord."

**Takeaway**: A sinner is **converted** into a Disciple of Christ by the Holy Spirit. They become **convicted** of their **sin**(s), **repent**, and **believe** in the righteousness of Christ and Judgment Day.
