Text: Acts 17:11

The Series: Making of a Disciple

Topic: Ask PK

Text: Acts 17:11. And the people of Berea were more open-minded than those in Thessalonica, and they listened eagerly to Paul's message. They searched the Scriptures day after day to see if Paul and Silas were teaching the truth. (NLT)

Talk: "We're in search of the **truth** of the **Scriptures** (humility), and not in **defense** of ourselves (pride)."

QUESTION 1. Can God no longer hear your prayers when you continually struggle with a certain sin? I have a desire to do what's right but find myself consciously committing the same sin over again. This sin has done so much damage to my relationship.

ANSWER: a) God will always hear prayers from a broken and repentant heart! (Psalms 51:17); b) You must be guided by the Holy Spirit. (Galatians 5:16); c) Some sins are strongholds and you may need someone to pray through with you until you're set free. (James 5:16); d) Sins have consequences that you must live through. (Galatians 6:7-8)

QUESTION 2. Can you expound on the historical purpose or current day principle behind the term AMEN and whether it even has anything to do with gender? I was thrown way off by the ending of that House prayer video and none of my research has provided much resolve. I Chronicles 16:36

ANSWER: a) Amen is **neuter**; b) Amen is a Hebrew word, which means certainty, truth, or so let it be; c) Amen comes from the **conviction** of the heart to mean, what they hear is true, just, and certain to be; d) Amen is the highest praise because it confirms your obedience (agreement) with God.

QUESTION 3. Are you against activism?

ANSWER: No! ... But! ... The **primary** message of a Christ Follower is **evangelism** and the **secondary** message is **activism**. References: John 18:36, Luke 24:46, I Corinthians 15:24, Romans 12:13, Micah 6:8

"Activism is for legislation and evangelism is for salvation."

QUESTION 4. Pastor, do you **repent** once for **all your sins**, or do you **repent** each time a **sin is revealed** to you?



ANSWER: a) You repent from sin and turn to Christ by faith, so you can be reconciled to God and become a new person in Christ. (Acts 20:21); b) You continue to confess your sins after salvation, so you can be cleansed and remain in fellowship with God. (1 John 1:8-9)

QUESTION 5. My question regarding the message I know some have a **special call** in their lives just like the disciples did, or like you when God called you to walk away from the Air Force. Others are not called to **leave everything** ...and start a new journey! Are those who aren't called to **walk away** from **everything** still make it to heaven? And what is the difference?

ANSWER: a) All Christ followers are called to leave "everything". We're all called to exchange our life for Christ's life, by repenting from sin, denying ourself, coming out from society. (Luke 14:33); b) Offering God "everything" is made relevant to everyone, by God, when He ask you for something specifically. (Mark 10:17-23)

Wrap up: "When you fail to offer God what He ask for (everything), heaven is not in jeopardy, but your **maturity** in Christ is **stunted** and you have **forsaken** your walk with God and **forfeited** rewards in heaven."

QUESTION 6. What do you say to the believer that says: I don't really know or encounter people that are **not believers**? So **leading** people to Christ is hard. Living my life right before God is how I show people I am a believer. I don't think you have to **Bible beat people to win them to Christ.** Is this still **discipleship**?

ANSWER: A Christ Follower who is engaged daily in soul winning live by these five principles: **a)** You **love** sinners (St. John 3:16); **b)** You live right and ask for **wisdom** (Proverbs 11:30); **c)** Your **witness** is like fire (Jeremiah 20:9); **d)** Your **eyes** can see opportunities (John 4:35); **e)** Your soul winning method is **seed**, **water**, and **growth**. (1 Corinthians 3:5-6)

QUESTION 7. I have heard you say, "If you are a Christ Follower, you should **lead** a **small group**". You have also stated, "that you aren't a Christ Follower if you can't and or won't". **Here is my question**; Why is being a leader of a small group a **determining** factor of whether you are a Christ Follower?

ANSWER: Gift of teaching is different from the ability to teach what you have been taught. A Disciple is a learner, who becomes like the teacher, able to teach what they have been taught, so they can share them with others or defend their beliefs against those who oppose the teachings of their Teacher (maturity).
