Message: The Review -- Call and Conversion

Text: Mark 1:14-17



Mark 1:14. Now after John was put in prison, Jesus came to Galilee, preaching the gospel of the kingdom of God, 15. and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand. Repent, and believe in the gospel." 16. And as He walked by the Sea of Galilee, He saw Simon and Andrew his brother casting a net into the sea; for they were fishermen.

17. Then Jesus said to them, Follow Me, and I will make you become fishers of men." **18.** They immediately left their nets and followed Him. (NKJV)

Why Review: Hearing the Message The **language** of the church is ______ (I Corinthians 2:13-16) and the **teachings** of the church is either _____ or **milk** (Hebrews 5:11-14). **Hearing** is to and **obey** whatever is being asked. "Hearing and obeying are synonymous." Reference: Exodus 24:7, James 1:22, Romans 2:13 **Takeaway: Shema:** hearing and obeying are synonymous - you respond to the teaching from the Scriptures by doing what it says. Disciple of Christ: "A person who submits to listen, learn, and become a loyal follower and communicator of the teachings of Christ Iway of lifel. Review: Call and Conversion 1. The Call of a Disciple - Mark 1:17. "Follow Me and I will make you become fishers of men." The **Call of Christ** to follow Him is both a to hearing God (Shema). A calling (vocation) comes with a strong impulse from Christ to embrace His purpose and way of living by obeying Him. By heeding the call of Christ to follow Him and serve His purpose, you're **responding** to Christ's **vocation** for your life.

- 2. The **Conversion** of a Disciple **Mark: 1:17.** Then Jesus said to them, "Follow Me, and I will **make you become** fishers of men." (NKJV)
- **St. John 16:8**. And when **he comes**, (Holy Spirit) he will **convict** the **world** of its **sin**, and of God's **righteousness**, and of the coming **judgment**. (NLT) **The Holy Spirit convicts us of:**
 - a) Sin folly, faults, and filth
 - b) Righteousness Christ
 - c) Judgment Day Assessment

One Message of the Church: The Gospel

Acts 20:21. I have had one message for Jews and Greeks alike-the necessity of repenting from sin and turning to God, and of having faith in our Lord Jesus. (NLT)

- > Repent from sin(s) (godly deep spiritual sorrow)
- **Reconcile** with God by faith in Christ (new birth)
- Follow Christ listen, learn, and become a loyal follower and communicator of the teachings of Christ

Gospel of Reconciliation - Solving the world's sin problem

- **2 Corinthians 5:16.** So we have **stopped evaluating** others from a **human point of view** (according to the flesh). At one time we thought of Christ merely from a human point of view. How differently we know him now!
- **17.** This means that anyone who **belongs** to Christ has become a **new person** (repented and reconciled). The **old life** is **gone**; a **new life** has begun (Christ follower)!
- **18**. And all of this is a gift from God, who **brought us back** to himself through Christ (reconciled). And God has given us this task of **reconciling** people to him (gospel). (NLT)

Takeaway: Conversion of a Disciple

- a) You **hear** the gospel
- b) You **repent** from sin(s)
- You reconcile with God by faith in Christ. You follow Christ, you listen, learn, and become a loyal follower and communicator of the teachings of Christ
