Scripture: Ephesians 1:9

A. Creation of Heavenly Beings

- 1. God is a **Spirit.** At some point in time, God created celestial beings to be part of His host and kingdom in the heavenly realm.
- 2. Lucifer, a celestial being, **rebelled** against God's **authority** and was removed from heaven along with the other angels (demons) who followed him, Isaiah 14:12-14, Revelation 12:9.
- 3. Lucifer became Satan (adversary) and along with his angels **now** participate in **a war** against God's authority (will) in the heavenly and earthly realms.

B. Creation of Earthly Beings

- 1. God declared at the assembly of the angels, He was going to make a **new species**, in 'Our image' called **man**, male and female, Genesis 1:26-28.
- 2. God made **man** a **body** from the **particles** of the ground and **breathed** the **breath** of **lives** (spirit/soul) into man's **lifeless body** and the **man** became a **living** person or **earthling**, Genesis 2:7.
- 3. God put the man (male and female) in **His home** called the garden of Eden, God's **sacred space**. The man would **assemble** to meet with God for **fellowship** and to listen to His **instructions**, Genesis 2:15-17.
- 4. God instructed man at an assembly, to be **fruitful**, **multiply**, and **fill** the earth; **subdue** it and have **dominion** over the earth, **not** to exercise their **freewill over His will** and eat from the tree of knowledge good and evil, Genesis 1:26-28. Genesis 2:16-17.

Takeaway: Earthlings were created to live within 'God's will' and carryout God's 'plan' for spreading His family (image) throughout the earth and establishing His dominion (kingdom) on earth.

C. Fall of Earthly Beings

1. **Fatal** conversation: Satan **tempted** the man (female/male) to **exercise** their **freewill** over God's will (authority) and they **ate** from the tree of knowledge of good and evil.

- 2. Fallen consequences: Death: Spiritual and Physical
 - a) Spiritual: detached from God, distorted thinking, and degraded behavior (soul and senses ruled)
 - b) Physical: lifespan 70-80 years full of pain and sorrow, goes by quickly
- 3. Foreshadow of Redemption, Genesis 3:15
 - a) Resentment between serpent's seed (world/culture) and her Seed (Christ/Israel/Church).
 - Redemption: He shall bruise your head (blood/death and resurrection) you shall bruise His heel (death on cross).
 - Religion was instituted by God; doing ritual acts of worship (sacrifices) that maintains fellowship with God and gains God's favor. Genesis 3:21-24

Message: God's Redemption Plan – Ephesians 1:9

Redemption Plan: At the right time he will bring everything together **under** the authority of **Christ**-everything in **heaven** and on **earth**.

Balance lifestyle (spiritual and earthly)

- Consecrate spiritual life separated unto God
- **Cultivate** natural life improved by labor, care, and study
