THE SPECTRUM OF DISCIPLESHIP COMMUNITY



- 28% of Christians are in a discipleship community
- 39% are not involved in any form of discipleship
- 28% only being discipled
- 5% are discipling others

Importance


- When we help others grow in their faith, it also helps us grow in our faith (The result is mutual spiritual growth)
- Discipleship equips Christ Followers with a solid Biblical foundation.






U.S. CHRISTIANS ON WALKING WITH JESUS

Not Just Facts

"The discipleship process is more than teaching people the <u>right knowledge</u> about God. A disciple <u>models</u> him or herself after someone. Making disciples of Jesus goes <u>beyond</u> teaching facts about Jesus. It means <u>teaching</u> people how to <u>know</u> and <u>be like Jesus</u> — to <u>obey</u> God and <u>seek</u> His best for their lives."

<u>Acts 5:42</u> And every day, in the Temple and from house to house, they continued to teach and preach this message: "Jesus is the Messiah."



<u>Purpose</u>Multiplication

- Conformity
- Accountability



Q: How long does discipling another person last? A: As long as it takes

Q: Do you have to be saved for a certain amount of time to be a disciple maker? A: No

Q: Who should Christ Followers disciple? A: Everyone

Jesus told the disciples to "follow me"

Where do I start?

- Pray for a heart to make disciples
 - Everyone is commanded to make disciples, no exclusions.
 - Pray God give you the opportunity and that you recognize the opportunity when he presents it.

• <u>Be Intentional</u>

- You must be willing to be consistent. If the person strays pursue them.
- Develop an individual and corporate culture of discipleship



Where do I start?

- <u>Be Available</u>
 - Be available to give your time and knowledge to a person on a regular basis.
 - Discipleship is a daily effort, pursuit and sacrifice, but worth it in the end.
- Keep the focus on Jesus
 - We want to make disciples who follow Jesus and His ways, not our own.
 - "Follow me as I follow Christ."


Offer a solid foundation for scriptural understanding. It is for those people who want to learn even more about familiar biblical concepts and break them down to an applicable level.
