Proverbs 3:5. Trust in the Lord with all your heart, and do not lean on your own understanding. **6.** In all your ways acknowledge him, and he will make straight your paths.

Objective: to teach the principles to follow in prayer, so we can hear God's voice directing our lives.

Review:

1. <u>Hearing</u> God's voice. It's a **requirement** to hear God's voice to be His people and follow Him. It is like sheep learning to know the Shepherd's voice and following Him. (John 10:3-27, Jeremiah 7:23, Psalms 143:8, Matthew 4:4)

2. <u>Listening</u> to God's voice. You enter God's House to **listen** to God's word, so you can **learn** to **fear** Him. You give God your undivided **attention**, you **absorb** the content in what you are hearing, so you can **apply** it. (Ecclesiastes 5:1)

3. <u>Knowing</u> God's natural voice. God speaks to us **directly** from His Spirit to our spirit. He also speaks to us **indirectly** through various human vessels to convey His words to us. (I Thessalonians 2:13)

4. Opening the door to God's voice. When we find out Christ resides outside of our souls, we must zealously repent to let Christ in by confessing we no longer live but Christ lives in us by our obedience to His Spirit. (Revelations 3:14-22)
5. <u>Confirming</u> God's voice. We confirm God is speaking to us by 1) Spirit to spirit , 2) the Scriptures , 3) evaluated by church leaders, 4) it matches our calling, gifts, and character, and 5) it glorifies God. (I Corinthians 10:31, I Corinthians 14:24-29)
