Introduction:

v3. Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has <u>blessed</u> us with every **spiritual** blessing in the heavenly places in Christ,

Point: We're spiritually blessed in Christ above.

This verse highlights the blessings we receive in Christ are spiritual blessings, not earthly blessings.

Application: How can you be more intentional about seeking your spiritual blessings?

Point: You're God's chosen from above in Christ.

Questions:

- a) What does it mean to you personally that God chose you?
- b) How does knowing God chose you before the world began change how you see your identity and purpose today?
- c) Do you rest in being chosen in Christ or do you still feel unworthy and strive to please God through your self-efforts?
- You're _____ v4b. that we should be holy and without blame before Him in love.

Point: Holiness is the means and love is the context.

Questions:

- a) What does it indicate **holiness** is the means and **love** is the context?
- b) Do you see holiness as a **burden** or a **blessing** explain?
- c) How do you view the refining fire of I Peter 1.7 in view of God restoring you in Christ to stand before Him holy and blameless in love?

Application: Based on understanding holy is the means and love is the context, what area can change in your life – thought life, speech, habits, or relationships?
